Dear Secretary Noem,

I write to you with deep concern regarding the presence of agents of the murderous Castro regime and the Communist Party of Cuba currently residing in the United States. It is imperative that the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) enforce existing U.S. laws to identify, deport, and repatriate these individuals who pose a direct threat to our national security, the integrity of our immigration system, and the safety of Cuban exiles and American citizens alike.

The Cuban Adjustment Act and other humanitarian immigration programs were designed to provide refuge to those fleeing persecution from the oppressive Cuban dictatorship. Unfortunately, there have been several reports indicating that individuals with direct ties to the Communist Party of Cuba and the repressive state security apparatus have successfully gamed our immigration system, gaining entry under false pretences. This is an affront to the principles of our nation and a direct insult to the many Cuban exiles who have sought freedom in the United States.

I have attached a list of Cuban nationals, with ties to the Castro regime currently living in the United States, who have been denounced by independent non-profit organizations and watchdog groups for perpetrating countless human rights abuses. I urge DHS to thoroughly vet this list and immediately begin deportation proceedings on those who have violated our public safety immigration laws.


The presence of these regime operatives not only endangers our communities but also provides a foothold for the Cuban dictatorship to engage in espionage, political coercion, and illicit activities within our borders. It is unacceptable that the United States would provide sanctuary to individuals who have actively worked to oppress and persecute the Cuban people, especially when countless legitimate asylum seekers await their opportunity to seek refuge in our country.

I urge you to take immediate and decisive action to:

1. Investigate and identify individuals with ties to the Communist Party of Cuba and the Castro regime who have entered the U.S. under fraudulent pretences.
2. Enforce existing immigration laws to deport those found to be in violation.
3. Strengthen screening measures to prevent future abuses of our immigration system by individuals affiliated with hostile foreign regimes.

The United States must remain a beacon of hope and freedom for those escaping tyranny—not a safe haven for those who have been complicit in perpetuating it. I look forward to your prompt attention to this urgent matter and stand ready to work with you to ensure the integrity of our nation's immigration laws.
